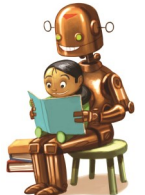

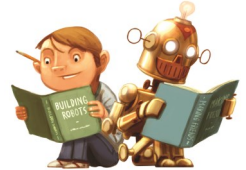
READING TOGETHER ROBOTS- *for listeners not yet reading on their own*
