43rd Annual Allegheny County Chess Tournament - Saturday, February 6, 1 - 4PM

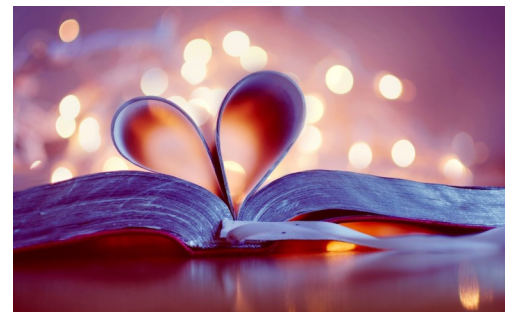

My Library Story

We each have our own library story. Where was your first library experience? Many first time library experiences happen as a very young child. A parent, grandparent, caregiver, relative or friend takes the small hand of a child and opens the doors to a lifetime of visiting libraries.

My first library was at the corner of Montana Avenue and 17th Street in Santa Monica, California. Built in 1960, the library was an expansion of the Santa Monica Public Library system established in 1895 -- some years after Sewickley was organized as a library. How remarkable to discover that Pittsburgh philanthropist Andrew Carnegie provided a \$12,500 grant in 1903 for the Santa Monica Public Library system to erect a library building. In Pittsburgh, we've seen Mr. Carnegie's commitment to public libraries; it turns out that he impacted communities across the country as well.

As a child, I spent many afternoons and weekends visiting the local library, borrowing books and enjoying the quiet and relaxed setting with every visit. During my high school years I spent many hours studying and making use of the resources of the Concord, Massachusetts Free Public Library. This community is also well known for its literary residents, Thoreau, Emerson and Alcott. Wherever I've lived, the local public library has always been a welcoming, familiar place, ready to lend me books and resources, in a safe and comfortable setting.

What takes place in these treasured library spaces is still very much the same as my first visit, yet also much more. Gathering for a story hour, using reference services, checking out a best seller, or spending time in a quiet yet public space has expanded to include activities that use words such as innovation, collaboration and technology. Today and throughout our lives, local libraries, including our Sewickley Public Library, play a vital role in the daily lives of citizens, people like you and me.

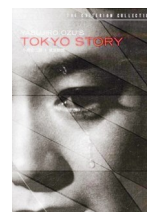

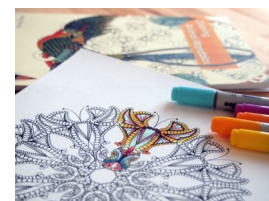
